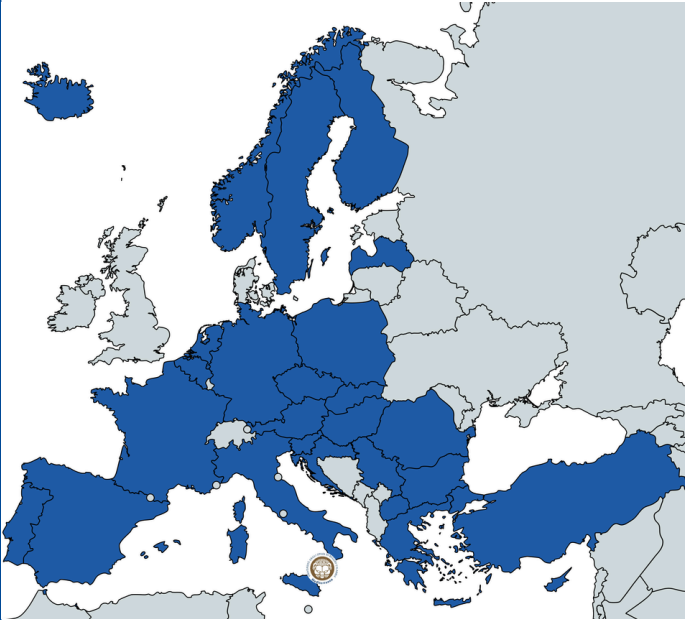


## What is Erasmus+?

The ERASMUS program (European Region Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students) allows European university students to spend a period of study at a foreign university.

The "Mediterranea" University of Reggio Calabria actively participates in various actions of the Erasmus+ program, offering students the opportunity to spend a period of study abroad at a university in a European or non-European country that has bilateral student exchange agreements. This ensures the possibility of attending courses, utilizing university facilities, and obtaining recognition for exams taken, which effectively become a full part of the student's academic curriculum.

## Erasmus outgoing - study

Through student mobility for studies, students can attend lectures, take exams, and write their thesis at a foreign university participating in the program. Study mobility creates synergies between academic and professional experience abroad.

### Types of mobility for all study cycles:

- **Long-term mobility** ranging from a minimum of 2 to a maximum of 12 months (the 12-month allowance is per study cycle: 1st, 2nd, and 3rd level);
- **Short-term mobility** from 5 to 30 days, including a mandatory online component;
- **Blended Intensive Programme (BIP)** a new type of short, intensive mobility that offers an internationalization experience by combining a short physical mobility with a mandatory virtual component.



## Erasmus incoming students

The Erasmus+ program promotes the exchange of international students. Partner universities that have established bilateral agreements with our University allow their students to spend one or two semesters at UniRC. At the end of this period, the academic credits (ECTS) earned can be recognized and transferred as part of their study plan.

## Erasmus outgoing - traineeship

Mobility for traineeships allows students to undertake a traineeship abroad at an enterprise or any other relevant workplace in a country participating in the program. This opportunity is also open to recent graduates. Interested students must apply for the University call for applications before graduating, specifically during the final year of their study program. For recent graduates, the traineeship abroad must be completed within one year of graduation.

### Types of mobility for all study cycles:

- **Long-term mobility** ranging from a minimum of 2 to a maximum of 12 months (the 12-month allowance is per study cycle: 1st, 2nd, and 3rd level);
